



Entry Criteria

1. Who Can Enter

Anyone can enter a scheme or project for the Camden Design Awards. We welcome suggestions from anyone including local residents, local groups and associations, employees and businesses as well as architects and developers (please ensure the land or building owner is aware of the nomination being submitted).

2. Types of schemes that can be submitted

The Camden Design Awards are open to a wide variety of schemes, including small rear extensions, green roofs and walls, new or improved pieces of public realm, restorations of listed buildings, community-led schemes, housing-led schemes or even an exemplar approach to community engagement. The Camden Design Awards are aiming to reward schemes which:

- are inclusive, sustainable and fit for purpose
- demonstrate high quality in design, materials and construction
- respond sensitively to their context and reinforce a sense of place
- enrich the lives of those who live and work in and around them.

Key parameters for any submission are:

- Schemes should have been substantially completed in the last 2/3 years.
- Previously submitted schemes need not apply unless there are *special circumstances*, e.g. a scheme which was not previously eligible for consideration as it was not complete has since been completed and so is now eligible - please contact us if you need further clarification.
- Submissions will need to be accessible for the Judging Panel.
- Submissions must include a basic set of information (see 'What to include in your submission')

Where we feel the quality sufficiently high we may give Commendations as well as Awards.

3. What to include in your submission

It is important that we have a base level of information for each scheme to allow for a fair assessment, so for any scheme to be considered we will require:

- Scheme details:
 - basic details (Name, Address, Date of Completion)
 - overview (brief summary of scheme - approx 30-50 words)
 - type (e.g. Housing led, public realm, leisure)
 - scope (e.g. new-build, conversion, extension etc..)
 - ownership/design Team (Name and details of owner, developer, architect)
- Scheme Description (approx 200 words)
- A Site Plan
- Photographs/Images that give an overview of the scheme (approx 4-6)
- Floor-plans (where relevant or help demonstrate key aspects of the scheme)
- Submission contact details (main contact for any questions, arranging site visits etc...)
- **NB:** We welcome the submission of a presentation board/additional images in addition to the above information but this is not a requirement. Any images must be suitable for publication (see [Disclaimer Statement](#)).
