## UCLH Cancer Care Trust – Proposed Measures on Huntley Street, Mortimer Market & Capper Street, WC1E

We are seeking your views on the Council's proposal to implement parking changes on Huntley Street, Capper Street and Mortimer Market and the construction of a raised table at the entrance to Mortimer Market.

The council proposes to improve pedestrian safety and accessibility by constructing a raised table (road hump from kerb to kerb) at Mortimer Market at its junction with Capper Street which will help in reducing speeds of vehicles as they turn into and out of Mortimer Market from Capper Street. To accommodate the new raised table minor parking and pavement changes will be required.

The proposed measures include:

- 1. Construction of a raised table at the entrance to Mortimer Market.
- 2. Creation of an Ambulance Parking Bay outside of the entrance to UCLH Cancer Care Hospital, on Huntley Street.
- 3. Creation of 2 Disabled Parking Bays outside of the entrance to UCLH Cancer Care Hospital on Huntley Street.
- 4. Removal of the 'Keep Clear' road markings on Capper Street, with the implementation of 2 Residents' Parking Bays in place of the 'Keep Clears' markings.
- 5. The relocation of 1 Residents' Parking Bay on Capper Street outside property no. 2 20.

The reduction of Residents' Parking bays on Capper Street and also at the entrance to Mortimer Market is to allow for vehicular movement on entering and exiting Mortimer Market. The drawing attached illustrates the proposed raised table with minor pavement and parking amendments as described above.

The proposed measures will create two additional disabled parking bays for blue badge holders wanting to visit the hospital and the relocation of 3 residents parking bays on Capper Street. As a result of these proposals there will be no loss residents' parking bays. The implementation of the raised table at the entrance to Mortimer Market will provide a convenient level crossing point for pedestrians, promoting pedestrian priority. To assist those with visual impairments, tactile paving will be provided at crossing points.
