LATE NIGHT LEVY

NOTICE OF PROPOSAL TO INTRODUCE A LATE NIGHT LEVY IN THE LONDON BOROUGH OF CAMDEN

Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011, Chapter 2 of Part 2
The Late Night Levy (Application and Administration) Regulations 2012
The Late Night Levy (Expenses, Exemptions and Reductions) Regulations 2012

The London Borough of Camden is hereby giving notice of its proposal to introduce a late night levy for premises that supply alcohol between midnight and 6am in the borough of Camden.

- 1. The Council proposes that the late night levy will be introduced on 28 April 2016.
- 2. The Council proposes that the late night supply period should be midnight to 6am.
- 3. The Council proposes to exempt premises from paying the levy if the premises is authorised to supply alcohol for consumption on the premises between midnight and 6am on 1 January in every year (but are not authorised at those times on any other day in any year).
- 4. The Council is not proposing to apply any other exemptions
- 5. The Council is proposing to apply a reduction of 30% for qualifying premises which are subject to Small Business Rate Relief as defined in regulation 5(1)(b) of The Late Night Levy (Expenses, Exemptions and Reductions) Regulations 2012
- 6. The Council proposes that 100% of the net amount of the levy payments will be paid to the Mayors' Office for Policing and Crime on the agreed understanding that the full revenue amount is retained and used in Camden.
- 7. The Council will allow licence holders to vary their licence free of charge if they wish to avoid operating in the late night supply period. Applications must be received no later than two months after the date on which the levy is introduced.
- 8. The Council would like to hear your views on whether it should apply a reduction of 30% for premises that pay a levy to a Business Improvement District (BID).

Please note that we must receive your views no later than mid-night on Monday 9 November 2015 otherwise we may not be able to consider them.
