


Camley Street Entrance Improvements

We aim to improve access into and around St Pancras Gardens, and improve the pedestrian route link between Somers Town and Kings Cross. The Camley Street side of the gardens, is expected to receive a higher footfall with the nearby Somers Town footbridge and housing developments.

To address this, we propose to create a step free access ramp at the Camley Street entrance. This is an initial proposal that we are exploring. We welcome your views at this early opportunity to obtain your feedback to develop the design.





- The existing entrance, brick wall, gates and steps will be retained. Handrails to be installed on existing steps.
- New ramp access will begin next to the existing entrance.
 New brick walls will be created matching the existing brickwork on the entrance.
- Significant excavation works to be carried out under an archaeological watching brief and the removal of two trees.
 Sensitive approach to be undertaken liaising closely with the Church.
- Surfacing, railings and gates are yet to be chosen but will be sympathetic to the appearance of the Gardens.
 Further engagement will take place on final proposals.





Next Steps

We will consider feedback from this engagement and finalise proposals by Autumn 2018. Further engagement on the ramp will be carried out in Summer 2018.
