
CA-D, King's Cross Area, Controlled Parking Zone and Safe and Healthy Streets Consultation

September - October 2025

Overview

We want to hear your views on the Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) hours of operation in CA-D, King's Cross area Controlled Parking Zone, and other improvements you might like to see in your area such as electric vehicle charge points, bike hangars, car clubs and dockless e-bike / e-scooter hire stations.

The area covered by CA-D and its hours of control as well as those of neighbouring CPZs is shown below.



The current hours of operation for CA-D, including CA-D/E are (controls cover Single Yellow Lines, Paid for Parking, Resident Permit Holder Bays, Permit Holder Bays, Shared-Use Bays, Solo-motorcycle Bays):

There are approximately 1369 active residents permits issued for 1461 resident parking spaces within the CA-D CPZ.

WHY YOUR VIEWS MATTER

Policy Context

The Camden Transport Strategy (CTS) sets out a vision of healthier streets and travel across the Borough, including an objective to reduce inessential motor vehicle ownership and use, and helping enable cleaner, more sustainable types of transport and leaving more space on the roads for those who need it the most.

Parking policy is a key method to help achieve this, including the hours of control of our Controlled Parking Zones (CPZ). We are now reviewing CA-D CPZ to make sure that its hours of control are in line with our policies in our Transport Strategy and the views of our stakeholders, including residents and businesses.

Controlled Parking Zones Study/Recommendations - CA-D

In 2022, we completed a study of all CPZs in Camden to determine how the reviews should be prioritised to contribute to meeting objectives of the CTS. The study also identified issues in our CPZs and recommended hours of operation to help address them. Having completed the highest priority CPZ reviews already, we are now consulting on potential changes in CA-D, which (along with CA-C and CA-E) are the next priority areas for review.

In CA-D issues identified by our study included that hours of parking operation of the CPZ should better reflect how the area is used (including the night-time economy) and help improve air quality. Potential alternative hours of control for CA-D, based on the findings of the study, include:

- Extending Monday to Friday hours of control to 07:00 to 21:00.
- Extending Saturday hours of control to 08:00 to 20:00.
- · Adding Sunday hours of control.
- Dividing the CPZ into smaller sub-zones (along Guilford Street).

In addition, 24-hour control is also an option, as it is already in operation in the neighboring CA-C zone.


Figure 1: Example of a car club bay





In 2018, we consulted on potential changes to the CA-D CPZ, and feedback received highlighted that there was more demand for extended hours of control south of Guilford Street, than north of it. It is possible following this consultation we may decide to trial different hours of control in these two areas, and the consultation seeks your views on that idea. The map presents the possible smaller sub-zones.

SEEKING YOUR VIEWS

In line with that study and recommendations, we are now seeking your views on any potential changes to hours of control in CA-D CPZ and whether or not to split the CPZ into two smaller subzones, which are included on Map 2 above.

CA-D CPZ permit holders would still be able to park in both sub-zones, if that idea was progressed following this consultation. A proposed split into sub-zones would have an impact on the CA-D/E, which would fall under changes to sub-zone 1 as seen on Map 2 above. Any proposed changes as part of CA-D CPZ would not impact CA-E/D CPZ.

Your views are important in helping us, alongside data/information and relevant policies, in determining whether to introduce any changes. Recent changes in other CPZs have been introduced as an initial trial, for a period of up to 18 months, and

any amendments to CA-D could be implemented on a similar basis following this consultation. As parking controls and healthy street improvements can affect anybody living in or visiting an area, we want to hear from everyone who may be impacted by any changes — regardless of whether you own a motor vehicle(car, van or motorcycle) or not.

NEXT STEPS

After the consultation closes, a report detailing the outcome and recommendations will be submitted to the Cabinet Member for Planning and a Sustainable Camden for a decision, which we would expect to take place over winter 2025/26.

If any changes are recommended and approved by the Cabinet Member, a statutory consultation would be undertaken in June/ July 2026. Under this, the changes would be advertised in local newspapers and a letter sent to all addresses in the CPZ.

If any changes are proposed to be implemented as a trial, objections during the statutory 6-month period of the trial would be carefully considered, alongside data, monitoring and engagement activities, as part of further decision-making processes ahead of making any potential permanent changes.

Questionnaire Section B - CPZ Hours of Control

Parking

Camden is a dense mix of residential, business and other uses – this variety is part of what makes Camden a good place to live and work. However, the wide range of parking demands mean we must balance the needs of residents, visitors and businesses. Furthermore, demand for parking space is high and often exceeds the supply available.

At the same time, we want to encourage people to move in the most efficient and sustainable ways possible. To achieve this, we will improve conditions for walking, wheeling and cycling, including making these movements safer, and improving the flow of public transport.

This approach supports the objectives in the Camden Transport Strategy, which includes the goal of reducing inessential motor vehicle ownership and trips within the borough. This helps to meet Camden's ambitious sustainable transport goals and means there is more space for essential vehicles (e.g. emergency services, public transport and deliveries) and people who need to use the roads the most.

It's important that parking arrangements are reviewed regularly to ensure they continue to meet the objectives above and local needs.

In 2022/23, we updated our (pre-pandemic study) study of all CPZs in Camden which determines the order in which they should be reviewed to meet the objectives of the Camden Transport Strategy. The study also identified issues in our CPZs and recommended changes in the hours of operation to address them.

CA-D was identified as a priority for review in both the original and updated studies. The study also recommended extending hours of control and dividing the zone into smaller areas. This aims to better reflect how the area is used - including its night-time activity/economy - improve air quality and align parking rules with nearby areas. These recommendations are included in the consultation options outlined in Questions B1–B9 below.

Before responding to questions B1 – B9, you might like to consider the following features:

There is an option to extend the hours of control to stop parking in the CPZ at no cost from Monday to Friday before 08:30 and after 18:30, on Saturday before 08:30 and after 13:30, and at all times on Sundays. This may reduce the number of car journeys to the area, but would reduce free parking opportunities for visitors (without visitor vouchers) as they would have to pay to park over a longer period of time. Neighbouring zones in Camden (CA-C) and in parts of neighbouring boroughs already operate with longer hours of parking controls for residents and other bays, which may cause displacement in affected areas. It is also possible that controlled hours may be different in sub-areas of a zone, which may help address local parking pressure problems that do not apply to the rest of the zone.






