HAVE YOUR SAY

New lockable cycle parking proposed for Tonbridge Street and Whidborne Street, WC1H.

I am writing to let you know that Camden Council is proposing to install one 'cycle hangar' on Tonbridge Street, WC1H and one 'cycle hangar' on Whidborne Street, WC1H.

Residents in Camden have told us that they would like to have more lockable cycle parking close to where they live. We know that a lack of somewhere to keep a cycle safely can put people off taking up cycling. As a result, Camden Council is rolling out a programme of installing cycle hangars across the borough. This is also in line with the [Camden Transport Strategy](#), which aims to encourage more residents in Camden to travel by cycle.

What we are proposing to install

We are proposing to install one cycle hangar on Tonbridge Street, on 2.5m of existing Car Club Bay (with the Bay extended 2.5m in the direction of Cromer Street), and one cycle hangar on 2.5m of Resident Permit Holders Bay on Whidborne Street (with a similar 2.5m extension to the Parking Bay).

A plan of the proposals is shown on the drawing overleaf

- One 'Cyclehoop' secure cycle parking unit (providing storage for up to 6 cycles).
- Each unit is 1.36m high with a curved profile roof (see images below).
- The annual membership fee for a single space within a unit is £30.00. (Excluding VAT)

Are you eligible?

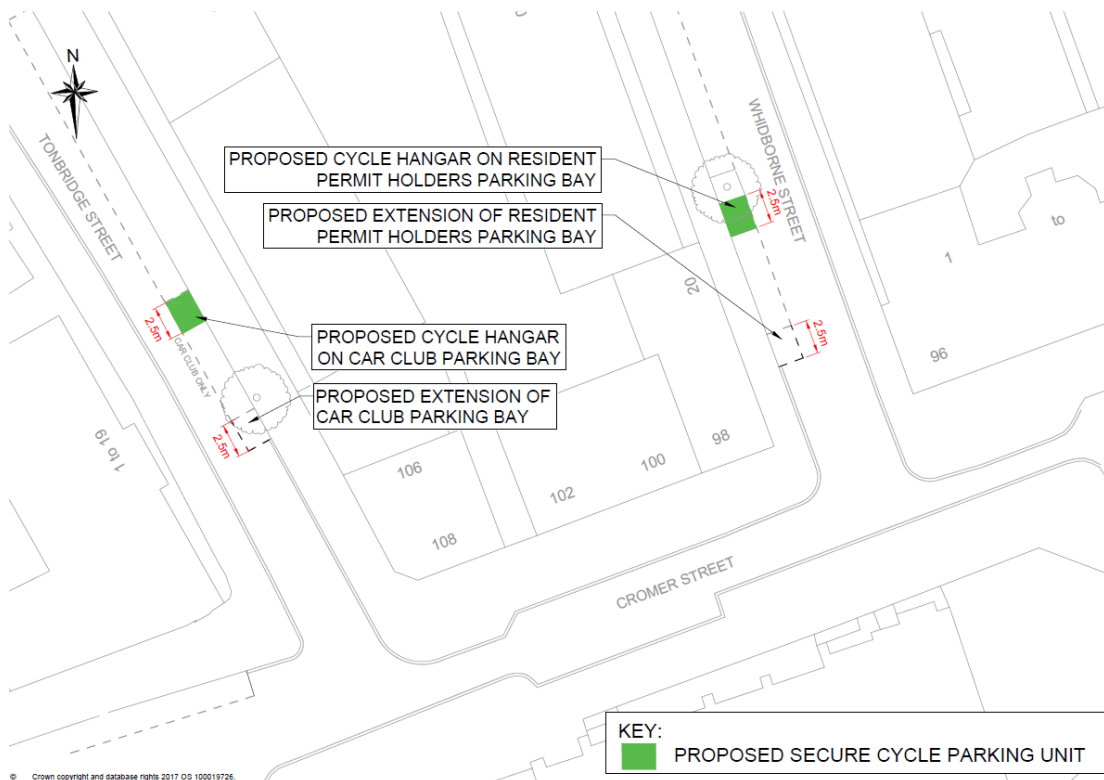
The criteria for being able to hire a space in a cycle hangar prioritise residents who:

- Live on the street (or an adjacent one) where the hangar is proposed; and,
- Do not have suitable outside space for keeping a cycle.

The council installs the unit while the manufacturer (Cyclehoop) will maintain the hangar. The cost of maintenance is covered by the annual membership fee.
