FREIGHT AND SERVICING ACTION PLAN



We have developed a draft Freight and Servicing Action Plan (FSAP), to support safe, clean and efficient deliveries, freight and servicing operations in our borough. It will help us meet the objectives in the Camden Transport Strategy.

It outlines our proposed actions that we hope to implement, using the three principles of effective freight and servicing management: **Reduce**, **Remode**, **Retime**.

Reduce

Reduce the number of vehicles and trips associated with freight and servicing



Remode

Transfer freight operations to lowemission alternatives, such as pedestrian portering, cargo bikes, electric vehicles, and



rail- and water-based transport.

Retime

Reschedule freight operations outside of peak hours



What is FSAP?

The Freight and Servicing Action Plan (FSAP) sets out Camden's vision, targets, and actions for making freight, servicing, and deliveries safer, cleaner, and more efficient, helping us achieve the objectives outlined in the Camden Transport Strategy and other key policies.

Why is your feedback as a freight and servicing operator important?

Our goal is to make sure Camden continues to be a great place to do business and support the social and economic needs of people. We are seeking input from freight and servicing operators to gain insight into their requirements and to identify opportunities for future collaboration.

As an operator, here are a few FSAP actions that may be relevant to you:

- Explore the feasibility of setting up micro-consolidation centres in underutilized spaces along with infrastructure to support sustainable last-mile deliveries
- Establish the feasibility of a foot porterage scheme to support last-mile deliveries from consolidation points across Camden

100% of all new light and heavy goods vehicles driven in London are zero emissions by 2040

0 killed or seriously injured casualties by 2041

80,000

freight vehicles enter Camden daily




While the mode share of HGVs in Camden has remained relatively constant, the mode share for **light** goods vehicles has been rising steadily



Approximately **27%** of all freight vehicles enter Camden during the morning peak



Together light and heavy goods vehicles contribute **36%** of NOx and **30%** of particulate matter from transport in Camden. They also contribute **28%** of road-related carbon dioxide emissions in the borough.
