

Frequently Asked Questions

1. **How do collapsible bollards work?** *The bollards are stored in the ground when not in use. School staff will be responsible for putting the bollards up and down at the required times.*
2. **How will I know when school term time is?** *The signage for the scheme will be folded during school holidays.*
3. **I am a resident or business in the pedestrian and cycle zone, how can I apply for an exemption?** *If the scheme is approved, residents and businesses in the affected area will be notified and given a suitable amount of time to apply for an exemption. (This only applies to the ANPR camera proposal).*
4. **I have a resident parking permit CA-H, but am not a resident within the zone, will I be exempt from the restriction?** *Yes (This only applies to the ANPR camera proposals).*
5. **I am a Blue Disabled Badge holder, can I apply for an exemption?** *Yes if you are a resident/business within the zone (This only applies to the ANPR camera proposal).*
6. **What happens next?** *Following the consultation, all responses will be considered by Officers and included in a Decision Report provided for the Director of Regeneration and Planning for consideration. This Report will then be made available on the Council website. Should any of the proposals be agreed, residents and businesses will receive a letter to inform them about the start date for the scheme with details of how to register for vehicle exemptions where necessary. Public notices advising of the changes will also be displayed on street.*
7. **What about traffic displacement?** *We have pre scheme traffic survey data as shown in the plan below. If we implement any proposals it will be under an experimental traffic order for a year, in order for us to carefully assess the scheme and any traffic displacement impacts.
