HS2 Road Safety Fund

Camden secured funding to improve road safety for communities along the HS2 construction route.

Engagement from 2022 to 2024 with residents, local community groups, schools, businesses and other stakeholders to understand issues in the area.

Feedback from the engagement, traffic data and council policies were used to develop proposals.




Changes to motor traffic: Osnaburgh Street

Introduced as an Experimental Traffic Order through an 18-month trial

Reduce the volume of cut through traffic


Creating a safe and easy to walk 'green link' between Clarence Gardens and Cumberland Market.





Changes to motor traffic: Stanhope Street

- Extension of current Healthy School Street
 - This enables more children to walk, cycle or scoot to school
 - Less air pollution, road danger, congestion, and more space for people to interact
 - Advance signage installed on adjacent roads
 - 18-month trial, with same operation hours
- Two new informal crossings


