The purpose of the processing

To find out what mental health services young people in Camden need and want. Questions asked were created by the Camden Youth Council Mental Health subgroup to gain insight into what their peers think as they are representatives for all young people in Camden. Once feedback has been analysed the results will influence the Camden Youth Council's campaigns for the year.

The legal basis for processing

Article 6(1)(e) of the GDPR- "Necessary for the performance of task carried out in public interest or in exercise of official authority vested in controller" and Article 9(2)(g) "reasons of substantial public interest"

The Categories of Personal Data

Age, gender, name of school you attend and email address (for receipt of a copy of your survey response or to send you a voucher if you are successful in the prize draw – there is a 'prefer not to say' option for all. Email addresses will not be shared with the Youth Council

The categories of recipients that the council has or will disclose the data to.

A summary of results from the survey may be shared with other Councils and/or published on the Council's website.

Whether the council will transfer their data out of the EU/EEA.

We will not transfer your Personal Data outside the EU/EEA.

The criteria used to decide the retention period

The data will be destroyed 6 months after completion of the project and will not be used for any other purpose.

Your Data Subject Rights

You have the right to request a copy of the information we hold about you, the right to ask us to rectify, erase or restrict processing of your data, the right to ask for data portability, the right to object to automated decision making, and if we are relying on consent the right to withdraw consent at any time.
